AP English Literature and Composition

Summer Reading Assignment will prepare you for classwork starting the first day. Without this reading accomplished, you will not be able to complete your classwork or homework for the first two weeks.

Assignment #1 Lord of the Flies

Read this entire novel. While reading, find the appropriate scenes listed below and make clear annotations (either written in the novel or on post-its). Find the most suitable passage and mark important words, phrases, actions, symbols, etc. These annotations will be reviewed in class and used in your first writing assignment.

Annotate the following scenes in the novel:

1. A description of a celebration
2. A scene of “madness”
3. A scene of a character feeling “alienated” by others
4. A scene that describes a Foil Character
5. A description of nature
6. A scene that shows a character conforming
7. A scene that shows characters either keeping a secret or sharing a secret
8. A scene that shows a character whose mind is conflicted
9. A description of the antagonist
10. A scene of cruelty
