

2022 Future Lawyers Scholarship Fund | Application Guidelines

Deadline: Saturday, April 30th at 4 p.m. Notification of Award: Friday, May 27th

Award Amount: \$5,000

Scholarship Criteria

The Future Lawyers Scholarship established by DRRT, an international law firm, will provide first-year law students with financial assistance as they explore their interest in law school. The recipient will receive a \$5,000 scholarship for three years of law studies with an opportunity to intern and attend events at DRRT. To qualify, applicants must have proven financial need, must be a resident of Miami-Dade or Broward counties, and be admitted to an ABA-accredited law school.

Submission + Deadline

Applications must be submitted online by Saturday, April 30th at 4 p.m.

Applicants must submit an application via the Foundation's online grants application portal. To access the online portal, please visit the **Scholarships** page on our website and carefully review the registration instructions.

If an application is missing information, our office will not inform the applicant nor review the application. Mailed, faxed, or emailed applications will not be accepted.

Eligibility

In order to qualify, applicants must:

- Be a resident of Miami-Dade or Broward counties
- Be admitted into an ABA-accredited law school
- Have an undergraduate GPA of at least 3.5 (3.5 GPA in law school will be necessary to renew)
- Have proven financial need
- · Have excellent oral and written communication skills
- Be a leader and involved within their community
- Contribute to diversity efforts through involvement in law school or other community efforts
- Demonstrate a strong interest in securities litigation, commercial or financial law

Selection Criteria

A Scholarship Advisory Committee will review and rate the applications and make final decisions on scholarship awards. The following criteria will be considered in evaluating applicants:

- Career and educational aspirations related to securities litigation, commercial or financial law
- School and Volunteer Activities / Work Experience and Community Involvement
- Letter of Recommendation
- Academic Achievement
- Financial Need
- Short Personal Video / Personal Essay Statement

The Future Lawyers Scholarship program is administered in partnership with The Miami Foundation. Applications are submitted through the Foundation's online system and provided to the review and selection committee for The Future Lawyers Scholarship Fund.

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Narrative Questions (There is a 1,000 character limit that includes spaces):

1. Financial Circumstances Summary: Summarize any challenging circumstances that impact you/your family's ability to pay for your college education. Your answer will provide the Scholarship Advisory Committee with a better understanding of the importance of this scholarship to your educational goals.

2. Community Involvement: Describe what you consider to be your most t important project or activity that you have led benefiting your school or community that has contributed to diversity efforts.

Required attachments to be uploaded:

- Personal Statement Essay (No more than 2 typed pages) or 2-minute video link: Describe your personal career aspirations and educational plans related to pursuing a career in the legal field.
- Letter of Recommendation (1): Please submit one letter of recommendation: the letter can be from a teacher or faculty member.
- Unofficial College Transcript
- **Resumé:** a professional resumé that lists your experience, both professional and academic.
- FAFSA Student Aid Report (SAR)
- University Financial Aid Award Letter
