MAGNET ENROLLMENT AGREEMENT

- Your academic progress will be monitored by ISPA and any significant decline in academics, effort, conduct and/or attendance during the school year will result in academic probation.
- Students must maintain a 2.5 unweighted Grade Point Average (GPA) in all academic subjects. Failure to maintain this GPA will result in academic probation for the student.
- Students accepted into ISPA are expected to maintain a minimum 2.5 in conduct and are to maintain above average grades in conduct while in the program.



MAGNET ENROLLMENT AGREEMENT

- Failure to adhere to the academic and conduct requirements will result in withdrawal from ISPA.
- Violation of the Miami-Dade County Public Schools Code of Student Conduct may result in probation or possible immediate exit from the program. http://ehandbooks.dadeschools.net/policies/90/index.htm
- A student who engages in conduct that is detrimental to the learning environment of the school (including faculty, staff, other students), whether it occurs on campus, off campus, or online will be disciplined by the school administration. This includes, but is not limited to:
 - Harassment, sexual and/ or cyber-bullying.
 - o Theft, extortion, arson.
 - Use, sale, distribution or possession on school grounds of any weapons, drugs (and paraphernalia), tobacco (and paraphernalia such as vape pens), liquor and/or fireworks.
 - Habitual truancy, absenteeism.
 - Cheating/Plagiarism

ATTENDANCE POLICY

- Students must be seated in their first/second period class at 7:20 a.m.
- A student who has ten (10) or more cumulative absences, tardies and/or early dismissals in an annual course or five (5) or more class absences in a designated semester course may have quarterly, semester and final grade(s) withheld.
- Students who accumulate 10 or more cumulative absences and/or 20 cumulative tardies will not be allowed to participate in interscholastic competitions, performances, and/or school activities for the remainder of the school year.
- Parents can request an admit via email @ <u>7571attendance@dadeschools.net</u>
 Parents can send an email stating the cause for the absence and attach any necessary documentation.

ATTENDANCE POLICY

- Students who are tardy to school must report to the office to secure an admit.
- Students will be issued a detention after their 3rd tardy and with every additional tardy.
- Excessive tardies may result in loss of privileges, detention(s), parent conference, and/or suspension.
- Students must not be picked up within the final thirty minutes
 (1:50 PM) of the school day unless the principal or principal's designee
 determined it is an emergency.
- Individuals not listed in the emergency contact card will not be permitted to sign a student out of school.
 - There will be no exceptions to this rule. Parents are to update emergency contact information as needed.

UNIFORM POLICY

- Students are required to wear straight cut, khaki pants.
- Pants must be worn at the student's waistline.
- Shorts, capri pants, cargo pants, or skirts are not permitted.
- Jogger pants and flare pants are allowed.
- Shirts may be Navy Blue, Hunter Green or Red and must have the ISPA logo on the upper left-hand side of the shirt.
- No open-toed or backless shoes: sandals are not permitted.
 - Sneakers are recommended for all students.
- Sweaters must be ISPA sweaters. NO other sweaters are allowed, except COLLEGE SWEATERS on MONDAYS.
- Club shirts can be worn on FRIDAYS.


