- It may state you have won an award for which you did not apply.
- It does not supply valid contact information.
- It often requires personal information such as a credit card # or a checking account # to "hold" or "verify" a scholarship

POPULAR (BUT FALSE) CLAIMS:

- "For a small fee, we'll give you a list of scholarships."
- "\$6.6 billion in scholarships went unclaimed last year."
- "You are guaranteed a minimum of \$1,000 in awards."
- "We have a 96 % (or some such impressive #) success rate."
- "We will do all the work for you."

 - ✓ **Please check your SCOIR Account for important emails, scholarship bulletin, the calendar for college visits and MYDRIVE for links and resources.**
- ✓ Invite your parents to SCOIR!**
