
## ISPA Summer Reading 2024 AP English Language and Composition

- 4. The other people who also went "into the wild."
- 5. The people who interacted with Chris and their impression of him.

## The Great Gatsby by F. Scott Fitzgerald

The first week of school, you will be given a multiple-choice test on this novel. The exam will focus on <u>details</u>; so, you must truly know the characters and plot. Pay attention to the following:

- Passages that describe the characters Daisy, Gatsby, Nick, Tom, and Myrtle
- 2. Passages that describe the settings West Egg, East Egg, and the Valley of Ashes
- 3. Passages that depict important moments of the plot, specifically the climax
- 4. Passages that incorporate aspects of the literary movement of Modernism (American Modernism)
- 5. Passages that explain the theme, or lesson, of the text
