<a href="#">The Carolyn Kelly Memorial Education Fund</a>	\$12,500	11/01	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Scholarships are for eligible individuals enrolled in and attending a 2- or 4-year accredited institution.</li> <li>- Marine biology, Ocean Ecology, Marine engineering, Ocean-related Environmental Sciences, Seamanship, Navigation, Marine Sciences, and any other appropriate field.</li> <li>- Looking for students who seek to make a difference as to the health of the ocean and ergo, to our planet.</li> <li>- Recipients must maintain a minimum grade point average of 2.75 for the entire year of College and/or University enrollment. Any recipient whose GPA falls below 2.75 at any time during the school year can be, at the Fund's discretion, dropped from the scholarship program and required to reimburse all funds.</li> <li>- Recipients must not be under disciplinary sanctions.</li> <li>- All recipients will be required for the period of one year, to submit progress reports about their progress to the Fund no later than one week after receiving evaluations from their Institute. Any individuals not submitting evaluations in a timely manner are subject to disqualification from the scholarship. It is valued at more than \$85,000 for the academic year and more than \$350,000 over four years.	11/01	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- In addition to the criteria listed below, eligible students are required to submit all <a href="#">First-Year Admission Requirements</a> by the Early Decision I or Early Action deadline of November 1.</li> <li>- Seniors; must be nominated by counselor.</li> <li>- Open only to U.S. citizens who are residents of Alabama, Florida, Georgia, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee, or Virginia graduating from an accredited high school within their home state.</li> <li>- Minimum unweighted GPA of 3.75 on a 4.0 scale and a well-rounded college preparatory curriculum are required.</li> <li>- Participation in school or community activities, a strong work ethic, and a history of overcoming significant adversity will be considered.</li> <li>- Submit an essay by November 7.</li> <li>- Submit must submit the CSS Profile and all relevant tax information before the November 15 deadline. <a href="#">Dr. Juan Andrade Scholarship</a>	Up to \$1,000	11/30	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Applicants must be enrolled or accepted for enrollment as full-time undergraduate students, in an accredited four-year or two-year institution in the U.S. or U.S. territories, and demonstrate a verifiable need for financial support.</li> <li>- At least one parent must be of Hispanic ancestry. Non-U.S. citizens are eligible to apply (DACA or Undocumented).</li> <li>- Applicants must be full-time undergraduate students for the Fall - Spring academic year. This includes high school seniors, college freshman, sophomores, and juniors up to age 25.</li> <li>- Must write an essay (can be found on their website).</li> <li>- Résumé and unofficial transcript required.</li> </ul>

<a href="#">Unigo Education Matters</a>	\$5,000	11/30	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Must be 14 years of age or older to apply.</li> <li>- Must be a legal U.S. resident.</li> <li>- Must reside in the 50 United States or the District of Columbia.</li> <li>- Submit an online written response to the question: "What would you say to someone who thinks education doesn't matter, or that college is a waste of time and money?"
