SCHOOL OVERVIEW:

ISPA is a language magnet public high school serving students from grades 9 through 12. The International Studies Program (IS) is the only program of its kind in the United States. The IS curriculum is a challenging collaboration between Miami-Dade County Public Schools (MDCPS) and the Ministries of Education of Spain, France, and Italy. Students pursue world language studies in addition to an academic curriculum with an international focus that addresses rigorous standards of both U.S. and European Union (EU) educational systems. Students study literature and humanities (history and geography) taught in the program language. Since its opening in 2010, ISPA has maintained a school grade of an "A" by the Florida Department of Education, and it is always ranked amongst the top schools in Florida and the nation.

CURRICULUM/INTERNATIONAL DIPLOMAS:

- IS Spanish program students may qualify for the National Diploma of Spain, Spanish Bachiller Diploma, in addition to the Florida High School Diploma
- IS Italian students who pass the AP Italian exam and three or four other AP exams as part of their American curriculum, will be permitted to enroll in any Italian University of their choice. This is also applicable to IE Italian students who become proficient in the language.
- IS French students wishing to study at a French University must hold a high school diploma and pass the DELF B2 exam (Diplôme d 'Etudes en Language Françoise) * A fee is associated with this exam.

GRADING/GRADING SCALE:

Miami Dade County Public School year has 180 days. The school year is divided into two semesters of four quarters, each quarter having nine weeks. Most courses are annual (1.0 credit) and receive final grades at the end of the year. For some courses worth .5 credits, the final grade is awarded at the end of the semester. Students are required to take eight classes per year on a modified block schedule. Students have four classes every day alternating between odd and even period days, each period lasts 90 minutes. Six classes are taught in English as part of the Florida High School Diploma requirements and two are taught in the language of the Program (Spanish, Italian, or French). The students GPA is updated three times a year (fall, spring, and summer) GPA is weighted for students taking AP and Honors courses. All course, semester, and final grades appear on the transcript. MDCPS does not rank numerically.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS:

The number of credits required for graduation is 24. In addition, students must earn a GPA of 2.0 or higher and earn 200 hours of community service hours. Required subjects include:
